



Horse Face and Leg Markings

Horses can be identified by the markings on their faces and legs. Here are some of the markings you may see on them.

FACE MARKINGS

| | |
|-----------|--|
| Bald face | White covering one or both eyes, the side(s) of the face and around the nostrils |
| Blaze | A wide white mark that runs down the middle of the horse's face |
| Snip | A white spot on the front of the muzzle |
| Star | A white spot on the forehead |
| Strip | A narrow white mark on the face between the forehead and the nostrils |

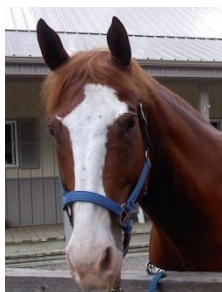
LEG MARKINGS

| | |
|----------|---|
| Pastern | A white band from the top of the hoof to the pastern |
| Sock | A white band from the top of the hoof to the top of the fetlock |
| Stocking | A white band from the top of the hoof to the knee or hock |
